

## Quick Poll Results-Some Dentists in the Dark About Patients' Sleep Apnea

The responses to the November 2016 Quick Poll about screening patients for sleep apnea varied greatly. About one-third of the 420 respondents don't screen for sleep apnea; a similar percentage ask their patients if they snore, or have the question on their health questionnaire. ## **How To Improve Sealant Retention Rates**

Dental sealants have been shown to help protect from caries the pits and fissures in children's and young adult's teeth.[1] But how you clean and prepare the teeth before applying the sealant is key to its success. Some forms of preparation aren't useful and others may predispose the teeth to caries after the sealant is gone, a research review and meta-analysis in the 2016 *Journal of the American Dental Association* found.

Dental providers use a variety of approaches to prepare teeth for a sealant, but the conventional approach-and it turns out to be one of the best approaches- is etching the tooth with an acid, which enables the sealant to bond effectively with the tooth. Read more...
