Key Note Presentation

Incomplete caries removal and caries risk assessment (CRA):

- One-step removal resulted in lower failure rates compared to stepwise and complete caries removal
- · Caries prediction is an inexact science
- Most frequently used CRA:
 - AAPD CRA guidelines
 - ADA CRA
 - CAMBRA
 - Cariogram

BREAKOUT SESSION 1:

Network study on understanding the dental information networks around novel nicotine products (NNP)

- E-cigarettes have uncertain implications for dental practice
- Rapidly changing products, environments, and treatments mean that dental practice needs will continue to shift

Proposed study:

- Goal: Address the current and growing information sources and networks in the dental community specific to NNPs
- Objective: Develop a comprehensive understanding of knowledge and information networks in the dental community

BREAKOUT SESSION 2:

Common Practices of Head and Neck Cancer Exams in US Dental Offices

- Oral and pharyngeal cancer in 2012: Projected 40,240 new cases and 7,850 deaths
- US head and neck cancer comprises 3-5% of all cancers

Proposed Study

- Goal: Survey practitioner oral cancer screening procedures
- Study design: Questionnaire survey and standardized case presentations



- 1. HPV and oral cancer pilot study
- 2. QuitAdvisorDDS: smoking cessation tool
- 3. Predicting successful single-unit crowns
- 4. Anterior open bite in adults
- 5. Predicting outcomes of root canal treatment
- 6. Management of TMJD pain patients



BREAKOUT SESSION 3:

Results from The Network Study on Isolation Techniques Used During Root Canal Treatment (RCT)

- 87% response rate
- Mean number of RCTs performed each month was 10.6
- 47% of respondents always used a rubber dam
- 15% of respondents never use a rubber dam
