

## Fluoride Treatment Recommendations Vary Considerably

In Japan, dentists vary quite a bit in how often they recommend in-office fluoride treatments for their patients, a recent survey of dental practices affiliated with the new Dental Practice-Based Research Network Japan (JDPBRN) showed. The survey asked participants how often they recommend in-office treatments with a fluoride gel, varnish, or rinse.
