Thursday February 20, 2014 Breakout Session I: World Café

Presentations

Dr. Paul Benjamin DMD: Practice-Based Research Networks and Evidence-Based Dentistry – How do they fit together and why should I care?

Dr. Benjamin provided an overview of evidence-based dentistry; not only what it is but also what it is not. The different levels of evidence were explained and what sources we can use to answer clinical questions in dentistry and medicine.

Dr. John Rugh PdD: Disseminating Research Findings: The UT Dental School Critically Appraised Topics (CATs) Program

Dr. Rugh provided an overview of the problems related to the dissemination of new research findings in the medical and dental practice setting. The use of Critically Appraised Topics (CATs), meta search engines and other internet technology skills to make evidence-based decisions about new products and procedures were reviewed.

Dr. Dan Beachler PhD: Oral HPV Infection and the Changing Epidemiology of HPV-Associated Head and Neck Cancer

Dr. Beachler described an overview of the epidemiology of oral HPV infection and HPV-associated head and neck cancer. Recently published studies were discussed including those describing an increasing incidence of this cancer as well as manuscripts exploring the potential co-factors related to this infection induced cancer. Dr. Beachler also gave an overview of the upcoming Human Papilloma Virus and Oropharyngeal Cancer Pilot Study.

Wave Methodology

Breakout Session III

Two different sessions were conducted during the last breakout session of the day. Dentists were able to see which studies they would be able to participate in over the next few years and asked questions to a panel of dentists/office staff who were involved in previous dental PBRN studies. Hygienists created three research questions from ideas generated from Breakout Session II.

Dentist Specific Studies

- 1. Decision aids for management of suspicious occlusal caries
 - 4-8 month, in-office study using one of two different devices to detect suspicious occlusal caries.
 - Assess the contribution of these devices in dentists' decision-making processes surrounding SOCLs
 - Full enrollees can participate
 - Status: Recruitment open, expected start date late 2014
- 2. Management of dentin hypersensitivity
- 4-6 month, in-office comparative effectiveness study of treatments already being used
- Patients report at 1, 4, and 8 weeks after treatment • Full enrollees can participate
- Status: Recruitment open, expected start date late 2014


Hygienist Research Questions

- 1. What method/type of in-office fluoride are you currently using? What is the efficacy of the method for hypersensi-
- 2. How often a sign or symptom noted during a hygiene appointment that would generate a referral for a medical consultation?
 - a. Focused on sleep apnea and erosion.
- 3. Would MLP increase access to care for underserved?

The three research questions generated by the hygienists will be handled by Rahma Mungia, Deputy Director of the Southwest Region. She will be contacting the hygienists involved to see if they would like to help further develop each question into a Study Concept.
