BREAKOUT SESSION 1:

Suspicious Occlusal Caries Lesions:

- Previous network study found that nearly 1/3 of patients had a suspicious lesion
- 1/2 of the lesions that were opened did not extend into the dentin
- Practitioners are looking for ways to more accurately diagnose these lesions

Proposed study:

- Practitioners randomized into 3 treatment arms: no device, DIAGNOdent[®], or CarieScan Pro[®]
- Collect patient-level information
- Practitioner decides treatment and records diagnostic and treatment information

Breakout Session Highlights

BREAKOUT SESSION 2:

Can Electronic Dental Records (EDR) Improve Your Practice and Be Used for Studies?

- Recent study of network dentists: 75% use computer to manage clinical information
- Collecting data from EDR eliminates need for paper forms

Proposed study:

- Investigate if EDR data can be used as part of a practitioner-led Quality Improvement (QI) initiative
- Implement a focused QI report on the success of root canal treatments
- Generate a patient data report to provide detailed information useful to you about all of your patients

BREAKOUT SESSION 3:

Cracked Tooth Registry

• Previous study found that more than 3/4 of all patients had at least one crack and 11% were symptomatic

• Most were associated with a large restoration

Study Proposal

- Identify risk factors for predicting adverse outcomes in symptomatic and asymptomatic
- teeth
- Evaluate outcomes of various treatments on cracked teeth
- Correlate internal and external crack characteristics

This study proposal generated high interest!

BREAKOUT SESSION 4:

Pain and Root Canal Therapy (RCT)

- Pain is known to be associated with RCT; before, during, after, and persisting
- Previous network study done to assess pain before, immediately after, one week, and 6 months post-treatment
- 16% still had severe pain 1 week post-op
- More than ¹/₂ were taking medication for pain 1 week post-op
- 6 months out: 1 in 10 still had persistent pain

Practitioners who attended were surprised by the 6-month findings

Study ideas generated at the meeting:

- Relationship between frequency of prophy recall and long term cost to patient
- Posterior composite follow-up
- Full periodontal charting follow-up
- Standard of care in rural vs. urban offices
- Implant follow-up
